At **Sumner Regional Medical Center**, we spent 2016 exploring ways to advance our mission of making the communities of Sumner County and the surrounding areas healthier. And by focusing our efforts on creating a place where people choose to come for healthcare, physicians want to practice and employees want to work, our more than 50-year legacy of caring for our communities is stronger than ever.

**Inviting the best physicians into our communities and supporting them** is one of the most important drivers of our ability to offer the best possible healthcare to our community. During the past year, SRMC added **31 new physicians** in a number of service lines, including radiology, internal medicine, gastroenterology, neurology and tele-neurology, orthopedic surgery, emergency medicine, urology and general surgery.

And while **delivering high quality patient care close to home** is the single most important contribution we make, there are many other ways we're making a positive impact in our communities.

In **creating excellent workplaces for our 1,130 employees**, we made **\$13,232,459 in capital improvements** in 2016, including including our new free-standing ER and Carpenter Cancer Center at Sumner Station, renovation of our endoscopy lab, construction of a second cardiac catheterization lab and a new helipad; and we managed and distributed an **annual payroll of \$64,750,784**.

We are proud to take a **leadership role in our communities** and are committed to delivering needed healthcare to everyone, regardless of their ability to pay. In fact, in 2016 we donated **more than \$5.28 million in healthcare services to those in need**.

We are also committed to **ensuring fiscal responsibility** – both at the hospital and in the community. In 2016, we paid a total of **\$2,357,109 in taxes**, as well as provided numerous sponsorships and donations to local organizations.
