At **Parkview Regional Hospital**, we spent 2016 exploring ways to advance our mission of making the communities of Limestone, Freestone, Hill and Leon counties healthier. And by focusing our efforts on creating a place where people choose to come for healthcare, physicians want to practice and employees want to work, our more than 50-year legacy of caring for our communities is stronger than ever.

Inviting the best physicians into our communities and supporting them is one of the most important drivers of our ability to offer the best possible healthcare to our community. During the past year, Parkview added **three new physicians** in orthopedics, emergency medicine and hospital medicine, and a certified family nurse practitioner.

And while **delivering high quality patient care close to home** is the single most important contribution we make, there are many other ways we're making a positive impact in our communities.

In creating excellent workplaces for our 183 employees, we made **\$2,116,210 in capital improvements** in 2016, including the purchase of a GE Optima MR450W MRI machine and the opening of our rural outreach clinic in Buffalo; and we managed and distributed an **annual payroll of \$11,969,489**.

We are proud to take a **leadership role in our communities** and are committed to delivering needed healthcare to everyone, regardless of their ability to pay. In fact, in 2016 we donated **more than \$3 million in healthcare services to those in need**.

We are also committed to **ensuring fiscal responsibility** – both at the hospital and in the community. In 2016, we paid a total of **\$271,226 in taxes**, as well as provided numerous sponsorships and donations to local organizations.
